A Christmas story in 24 episodes

An ice witch who threatens the very existence of all pixie life, a secret pact and a perilous quest of magical trials – these are the fairytale elements that make up this Christmas series for the whole family

The Pact is an adventure story about a young schoolboy called Malte and a pixie girl named Lyda. Both are of the same age and united in their battle to find the magical pact – the only thing that can save the pixies from being

wiped out entirely by the evil ice witch Iselin.

As a human and a pixie, the pair fulfil the magical criteria to find the secret pact. The pact's hiding place is protected by three magical tests – all of which will test the limits of Malte and Lyda's courage and their friendship. All the pixies' extraordinary gifts will be called upon, but also a stronger unity between the humans will be required, if the evil Iselin shall be ultimately defeated.

The Pact is a story concerned with themes of community and embracing each other despite differences. It is about the responsibility we have to the communities we are a part of and about the difficulties that can arise if we are not open to individual differences and if we do not treat each other with respect.

The Pact is a "Da Vinci Code" for children with a thrilling plot and mysteries that stimulate imagination and curiosity throughout all episodes. At times it is scary, to give children thrills and excitement – but it is never frightening. The humour is subtle because it is used to reveal the characters' distinctive features, vulnerabilities and peculiarities. On the visual side there is a strong poetic tone which makes the realism of the narrative and the fairytale elements work together aesthetically.

The viewer is in an inspired and animated universe where unexpected things can happen. Where magic takes place both when nothing fairytale-like is happening and when a hidden opening in a bush leads us into surrealistic landscapes with extraordinary creatures and beings.

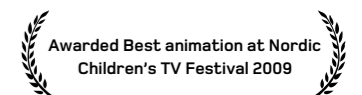
the tweetlings

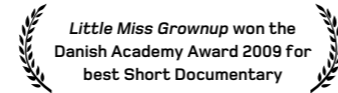

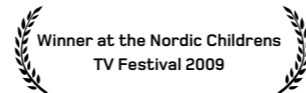

A 12 part series steeped with plot, drama, action and love

Lulu is a charming and independent mother of two with her own hair-dressing salon in the suburbs. She lives with Leon, the charismatic father and habitual criminal, who she has been seeing for 10 years. But when Leon is thrown in jail Lulu is forced to deal with a world she knows to exist but has no experience with.

In order to make ends meet, and while also trying to help Leon get out of jail, Lulu is forced to interact with Leon's criminal network. She comes face to face with a male dominated underworld full of gangsters, shady characters, Estonian hookers and of course, the charming but corrupt criminal detective Patrick Smith, whom Lulu soon develops feelings for. She starts off with an acute cash flow problem and is forced to pick up a little cash from Memeth, a used car salesman, and ends up as part of a huge plot to rob a money transport from the Federal Reserve carrying an unusually large amount of unmarked Euros.

Woven into this fascinating and elaborate plot are a series of easily identifiable stories. How will she find the money to pay her employees now that the police have

frozen her assets? How will she ensure fixed boundaries for her 7-year-old son who suffers from Asperger's Syndrome in these turbulent times? How will she explain to her teenage daughter the pitfalls of dating a gangster, when she is dating a gangster herself?

On top of excitement and action Lulu finds herself in a situation where she has to choose between two men. On the one hand, there is Leon; the habitual criminal whom she loves and who does so much for her and her children but at whose hand she also feels repeatedly betrayed. On the other, there is Patrick; the attractive policeman who seems to be able to give Lulu the comfort and stability she seeks but who also has deep cracks in his facade, closely scrutinized.

For the first time ever, a documentary goes behind the scenes and reveals the entire story behind a pirate hijacking

Desperate pirates from Somalia continue to make international headlines. At open sea they hijack cargo vessels, making hostages of both crew and international shipping companies. And as the hijackings pay off, the Somali pirates become more professional and better equipped to continue their terror of the seas.

7th November 2008 the Clipper

Shipping Company received an alarm from the captain of the CEC Future in the Aden Bay, off the coast of Somalia. He was desperately trying to evade an attack from pirates.

Following the alarm, Clipper immediately set up a team of experts and headed into uncharted territory. For how do you deal with pirates? And how do you react under pressure when the hostages become more and more desperate?

On opposite side of the conflict was Ali, the pirates' negotiator. In an unprecedented interview, he talks frankly about the tactics used by the Somali pirates and reveals what took place onboard the CEC Future. How, as time went by, tension on the ship mounted. The heavily armed pirates, chewing khat and fighting amongst themselves,

became more and more desperate as negotiations drag on.

Finally, after more than two months of negotiations and a series of dramatic events, an agreement was reached. It was time to go to the bank and make the most absurd cash withdrawal in the company's history. The money was dropped from the air and the pirates left the ship. Finally the crew members were united with their families.

Given unique and exclusive access to the negotiations between pirates and the shipping company as well as authentic radio communication and stills/videos from the ship, *Dealing with Pirates* is able to fully illustrate the dramatic events that surround a pirate hijacking.

Presented as a three part series of interconnected documentary films, *Shanghai Tales* portrays modern China through the lives of the people living in one of its busiest and most iconic cities

The series explores Chinese society via a set of topics that compliment one another and can also easily be related to by a western or global audience. The films are built around the core facets of human nature; love and loss, progression and

change, doubt and hope, happiness and melancholy. These stories provide a window into China, an opportunity to assess the similarities and learn from the differences between our cultures. The audience can empathise with the lives of the film's subjects as their experiences and dilemmas are familiar and universal concepts: The difficulties of childhood, growing up and developing through adolescence, the challenge of balancing work and family and the problems encountered by tradition, marriage and the expectations of family and parenting. Both moving and poignant, these stories are presented in an elegant and understated style, complimenting one another to paint a portrait of contemporary China through the unpublished lives of its everyday people.

Soon more than 550 cities world wide will have a population of more than one million. In 2030 80% of the world's population will live in cities

Megacities have traditionally been economic and political power centres but today the fastest growing cities are in developing nations. There is an acute need for new models of city planning to prevent collapses under such huge social, economic and environmental pressure. The NEW challenge is that cities today are made by citizens rather than city planners. If we are to create sustainability, it is an absolute necessity for us to understand the new modernity. *Cities on Speed* shows how four different megacities are dealing with this new modernity. What are the visions and the solutions and how do they affect the inhabitants?

space /shanghai

Shanghai is not just a city — it is an explosion of 4,000 skyscrapers, thousands of miles of highway, millions of citizens and thousands of government planners. Vast communities need to be expropriated to make way for new skyscrapers, roads and industries. The government tries to control it, the citizens try to use it but Shanghai is beyond control.

garbage /cairo

Previously only 12 million people lived in Cairo and the city was neat and tidy. Today Cairo has a population estimated at 20 million with six giant Garbage Villages that have evolved into towns within the city. Nobody can keep up with the speed at which the city is growing and their garbage piles up in the streets.

traffic /mumbai

Urban planning can be tough in the world's largest democracy! Mumbai is growing like it was on steroids and a collapsing infrastructure could put an end to economic growth. Public trains are filled to the bursting point, traffic is nearing a complete gridlock. An eight lane high-way is being built out in the sea to try to compensate for the threatening collapse.

behaviour /bogotá

In the early 90s, Bogotá was a city with big problems: Social inequality, pollution, out-of-control population growth and poor public transportation. Kidnappings were the order of the day and the city had the world's highest homicide rates. But unlike other poor megacities, Bogotá found a solution: In 1993 Antana Mockus stepped onto the scene and turned the city into one big social experiment.

The fans of the Argentinean football club Boca Juniors have founded the first Maradonian Church – also known as the Hand of God Church – to worship their football idol Diego Maradona. The church's congregation of 400 Diegorian Brothers considers Maradona's autobiography "I Am Diego" as their bible

The Diegorian Brothers celebrate

Christmas on the football star's birthday with a Christmas tree decorated with images from his playing days. According to the church, we are now in the year 48 AD – After Diego

When Boca Juniors score a goal, thousands of fans unleash clouds of blue and yellow confetti. Some light fireworks while others toss plastic bags onto the pitch. The bags are full of ashes – earthly remains of dead Boca Juniors fans. To be laid to rest at La Bombonera is their dying wish. Over the years, so much ash has been thrown onto La Bombonera that it has begun to destroy the pitch. The ash contains chalk and when it rains it hardens like cement. Boca's management therefore decided to build a cemetery, a Boca Junior cemetery exclusively for the fans.

"I've played for Barcelona and Brazil all over the world at all the major stadiums but I have never experienced anything to compare with playing at La Bombonera against Boca Juniors. It's the closest you come to Hell" (Romario, professional footballer)

The film has three main characters: Hernan, 42 years old, the intellectual who does not believe in Maradona as God despite the fact that Boca Juniors means more to him than earthly values. In contrast there is Pablo, 26 years old, who believes Maradona is God and places football higher than the love for his family. And finally, meet 75 year old La Tia, known by all as an extremely funny eccentric but behind the mask lures the tragedy and the solitude of an old woman.

are now able to grow corn in the warm weather, thereby saving a lot of money on cattle feed. Climate change is not an evil everywhere and paradoxically the countries responsible for polluting the atmosphere often are not the ones suffering the worst consequences.

Tembo is a farmer. He has a wife, four goats, seven hungry children – and one bag of maize flour to feed them all. As farming fails, he turns

to mat making for survival. Felida is a single mother with five children. Her eldest son just ran away from home, because she could not feed him. Now she begs odd jobs in exchange for some corn shells to feed the remaining four.

The home is run by Triveni and Ashok, who is in charge of rescuing girls from the brothels. But as the shelter fills to the brim, Triveni needs to get some of the girls back into society and she arranges marriages for four of them. As the wedding approaches, everyone is excited. Expect the four brides who barely know their future

husbands. Meanwhile the rest of the girls prepare their dresses and practice dances. And one day Ashok is accidentally drawn into a dance with Vibuthi. For once, as he holds her tight, he loses his cool. Maybe a romance is in the making after all.

Strong ties to the PFLP and its extreme political ideology made the gang an unusual criminal or-

ganisation in a Europe caught up in fighting terror groups such as the German Rote Armee Fraktion and Italy's Red Brigades.

The Invisible Cell tells the authentic story of a group of young idealists who lost their grip on their own ethical principles. They staked their freedom, other people's lives

and mobility in order to finance a cause they considered greater than themselves. They started as political activists but gradually became more and more involved in an organisation with multiple layers: some legal but others highly illegal. Some got out in time. Others stayed for some of the ride. And a handful went all the way.

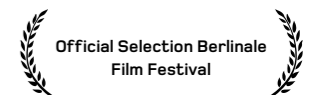


"When I read in the bible that I could be killed for being gay, I understood what it was like to be Palestinian" – Israeli bar patron

of love addicts we will discover the nature of this peculiar disorder. We will meet the love addicts in different stages of their addiction, in their communities and at treatment centres together with other patients and leading therapists when the rush for love goes too far. Love addicts fall in love with a fantasy. They seek someone to rescue them. They become extremely obsessed with the other person because they simply give up their own life to live it through someone else. They express their obsessions

in endless phone calls and e-mails, stalking behaviour, changing of wardrobe or religion, and sometimes to the extreme in change of personality.

Love addicts experience the same addictive patterns as alcoholics and drug addicts. They go through high and lows, relapses and withdrawals. The addiction might even drive them to commit serious crimes and hurting the one they "love" or themselves.

The film follows a number of love addicts, carefully casted for this film's sensitive subject, in various stages of their addiction.

The film will reveal the conditions under which the innocuous chocolate bar is produced, and follow the route from plantation to the shops, the consumer being ignorant of the full story of what chocolate actually contains. In the process those responsible will be held accountable.

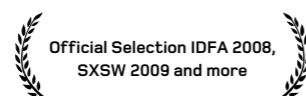

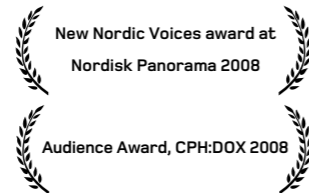
